The Rotary Park was attended to by the Gilmore Youth Groups with brushes and paint, planted trees and gave a general clean up.

President Rob thanked the ticket sellers and organisers of the Fashion Parade at the Calcutta. A fun Temptation Night was held.

A mock car accident was stage by member Michael Mastronardi (NSW Ambulance) with Issa Shalhoub being the victim. The Christmas Party was held at the Mollymook Golf Club with the Bartones performing, Santa (Graham Fisher) brought gifts for the ladies, crafted by Werner. Enjoyable evenings were arranged at Dom Fondacaro's, Tim Gregory's and a Bingo night.

Youth Exchange Karen Clausen returned home. Issa Shalhoub was the editor of the monthly DG Phil Mewett's Newsletter and PP Geoff Muir was on the District's RAM Committee. Our Club contributed \$3,000 to RAM and \$2,000 was presented to Michael Mastronardi for the Ulladulla Ambulance Service.

A working bee was organised at the Lookout in Milton and at the Rotary Park. Member John Ryan passed away. Funds were raised by the Club selling tickets for a play "Sweet Fanny Adams".

The Jumping Castle was in demand. 8,000 Tickets were available to be sold this year for our yearly Calcutta. Craig Saunders was thanked for the Business Awards. 2 students attended the Mogo RYPEN camp. Michael Mastronardi took 80 high school students to Goulburn for a Drivers Education Program.

We had the Christmas Party at Cupitts Winery. The Fire Side chat for new member was held at John Hozack's residence, organised by Werner. 360 Christmas Trees from Tim Gregory's farm were available for sale, promoted by the Times, the Garden Haven Nursery and the Rainbow Pie Shop in Milton.

The Coastal Patrol received a donation of \$2,000 from our Club. In January we had a meeting at the Lions Park and a meeting at Tim Gregory's farm. PP Clive Cross handled the Bowel Scan Program again.

We adopted 6 villages in Papua New Guinea. \$4,000 was donated to the Victorian Bush Fire Appeal and \$500 to the Queensland Flood Appeal.

Our Club supported the Entertainers in Ulladulla by serving drinks at the performances.

We visited the Ulladulla Mens Shed, our Club was first to make a donation for the project. A bowls night was held at the Ulladulla Bowling Club. A Dinner was held for partners of Rotarians at Maisie Bennett's residence.

A very successful Blessing of the Fleet Parade was held and we helped with the Ball. Phil Brown was presented with the Paul Harris recognition and was awarded a Sapphire Pin. PP John Hozack was named Rotarian of the Year, all past Directors received a Certificate as well as PP Tim Gregory and Rtn Issa Shalhoub, Craig Saunders received a Paul Harris award.

The Max Bayliss Community Service Award was given to Alan McDonald from the Lions Club of Milton Ulladulla. The Inaugural Friend of the Rotary Club of Milton Ulladulla and a Community Service Award went to Aaron Bennett.
