Max's subject was Legacy, which started as a promise in the WW1 battlefield to look after wounded soldiers' families.

The first group was formed in Hobart in 1923, now 49 groups (clubs) are in every State, Territory and in London. These clubs look after 109,000 widows, 1,830 children and people with disability.



The Mid South Coast group (our area) looks after 236 widows, (15 legatees), Legacy provides welfare, social, financial, education, emotional, medical and dental support as well as offer pension advocacy.

Max said that Legacy needs help, needs legatees and volunteers, specially in September for two days, collecting money on Legacy Day, as they don't get any government help.
